

INSTALLATION GUIDE

Quickfix is only suitable for timber joists.

To achieve a safe and long lasting Ekodeck+ installation, it is important to read the following guide in full.

Ekodeck+ boards are made for installation with the Quickfix Hidden Fastening System, providing you with a surface free of fasteners and a faster, easier installation.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Always use proper protective clothing and safety equipment when cutting and drilling.

Ekodeck+ boards are heavier and more flexible than traditional timber. Always exercise precaution and care when lifting.

Ekodeck+ Should Not:

- Be used in a substructure application.
- Be applied directly to a solid surface such as concrete.
- Have a cantilever (overhang edge of an Ekodeck+ board) greater than 20mm.

Warnings

- 1. It is the sole responsibility of the homeowner, contractor or installer to determine the specific requirements, effectiveness, suitability and safety in regards to any application or use of Ekodeck+ products.
- 2. Ekodeck+ is not designed to be a freestanding product. It must be installed safely and correctly fixed down to a substructure.
- 3. The substructure must comply with all the relevant regulations and aspects of the Building Code of Australia. The substructure must be anchored to the ground on all sides including the house.
- 4. Any single piece of Ekodeck+ must be installed over at least 2 spans (i.e. 3 joists) to keep within the structural load bearing limits of its design.

NATURAL VARIANCES & WEATHERING

Ekodeck+ is made from reclaimed and recycled materials. Whilst every care is taken to ensure consistency of performance and quality, natural variances will occur from one board/batch to the other in appearance, colour and texture. These natural variances are similar with those naturally found on timber decking and are designed to even out with time and weathering once installed.

The weathering process for Ekodeck+ will vary according to exposure to different climates, sunlight and moisture. Ekodeck+ boards will usually achieve their fully weathered colour within 3-6 months. Slight colour variation of Ekodeck+ boards will occur and are considered normal and not a defect or fault. Our aim is to replicate the variations found in natural timber to give your deck the most natural look possible.

INSTALLATION & FASTENING

Ekodeck+ is installed using the Quickfix Hidden Fastening System.

VENTILATION & CLEARANCE

When designing your deck, consideration must be given to ventilation. Proper ventilation and air circulation underneath and between boards is necessary to facilitate the evaporation of moisture and heat dissipation. If under direct sunlight, we recommend a ground clearance of 300mm to facilitate optimum airflow. However, if undercover, we recommend a minimum ground clearance of 100mm to facilitate optimum airflow.

Avoid the tendency to box or seal the deck in completely.

CUTTING

For best results, use carbide tipped blades. When using a drop saw we recommend a 60-80 teeth blade for cutting.



FIXING EKODECK+ WITH QUICKFIX TO TIMBER JOISTS


STARTER CLIPS

1. Position a starter clip against the wall on the first joist. Screw the starter clip into the side of the joist making sure the top of the side plate sits flush with the top of the joist.







2. Repeat on last joist. (Note starter clip is reversible for left and right use).




3. Run a string or chalk line from the front top corner of the side plate between the first and last starter clips.



4. With the top of the joists now marked, install the rest of the starter clips in line with this mark. Repeat this for every remaining joist.




5. Gently push the first Ekodeck+ decking board into the starter clips. You may need to angle the board slightly.







STANDARD AND LOCKING CLIPS


1. Insert standard clips and locking clips into the groove of the board as shown. (Note: only use 1 locking clip per board, which would usually go on the centre joist). Screw down approximately 2mm to hold the clips in place.







2. Push the next board into position.



- 3. Repeat these steps and lay approximately 6-10 boards before screwing down properly (this is a guide only). Measure out from the 1st board to the last board to ensure that the boards are square.
- 4. Screw down this section so the head of the screw sits approximately 1mm-2mm below the surface of the standard clip. Do not overtighten screws.
- 5. When installing the locking clip, ensure that the screw is tightened sufficiently so the teeth of the locking clip bites into the groove of the Ekodeck+ boards.
- 6. Repeat process until finished.

TIPS FOR THE FINISHING BOARD:

There are two options to finish off your Ekodeck+ deck.

1. Overhanging Board Finish



2. Exposed Fascia Board Finish

FIXING SPECIFICATIONS

	Specification (mm)
Residential centre-to-centre joist spacing (max)	450
Minimum ground clearance	100-300*
Minimum side-to-side gap	6 (Auto spaced by clip)
Minimum end-to-end gap (butt joint)	0-4**
Minimum gap from end edge to solid structures	2-6**
Minimum gap from side edge to solid structures	6 (Auto spaced by clip)
Minimum gap from end edge of board to breaker board	1-3**

EXPANSION & CONTRACTION

Ekodeck+ expands and contracts in length with changes in temperature. This is normal behaviour of any wood plastic composite and is not a product fault. It is most important to take this into proper consideration during installation of your Ekodeck+. Failure to do so will void any warranty claim.

The amount of expansion and contraction you experience is dependent on several different factors including:

- Seasonal climate installing in the peak of summer or winter
- \bullet Deck position if the deck is in direct sunlight or part shade etc.
- Local climate if the local area is subject to large changes in temperature during the day compared to the night
- \bullet Board length the longer the board, the more it will expand and contract
- Fully fastened boards you will notice less movement in the boards once they are fully installed/fastened down to the substructure

BUTT JOINTS AND EXPANSION GAPS

As a result of the aforementioned factors, leaving a 4mm expansion gap at the butt joint is a good guide. However, if you are installing in the peak of summer or on one of the hottest days for your location, close this 4mm gap and butt the boards together. If you are installing in the peak of winter or on one of the coldest days for your location, the required 4mm should be left as the boards have already contracted and need adequate room to expand as the temperature rises.

In moderate temperatures, we recommend leaving an approximate 2mm-3mm gap so it still has room to expand and contract as the temperature increases or decreases respectively.

Temperature	End-to-end gaps (butt joints)
Hottest day of the year	0mm (butt it up)
Average temperature	2mm-3mm
Coldest day of the year	4mm

Evenly spread your butt joints across the area of the deck concentrating them on 1 or 2 joists. Additional joist support is recommended to provide a greater fastening area and to avoid splitting the joist or the board (i.e. double blocking or double joist).

An alternative to using butt joints is breaker boards. Breaker boards can be used instead of butt joints in your installation and should be used if your deck is larger than 5.4m. For more information please refer to the section titled "Breaker Boards".

Tips:

- Allow the boards a few days to acclimatise to your site conditions. This allows your Ekodeck+ to adapt to the ambient heat typical of your location.
- Delay any edge/length trimming after installation is complete and preferably trim on a cool/moderate day.

BREAKER BOARDS


The longer the board length, the more the board will expand and contract. While Ekodeck+ comes in long 5.4m lengths suitable for most areas, you should use breaker boards where the deck length is greater than 5.4m. Ekodeck+ boards only expand and contract length ways, not widthways.

The use of breaker boards is an alternative design to butt joints and can be used to limit the visual effect of butt joint and mitre joint gaps opening and closing. A minimum end gap of 1mm-3mm applies when using breaker boards. If you are installing in the peak of summer or on one of the hottest days for your location, you can reduce this gap to 1mm. If you are installing in the peak of winter or on one of the coldest days for your location, a gap of approximately 3mm should be left. The diagrams below are for illustration purposes only.


Example of a breaker board design (recommended for decks longer than 5.4m):




Multiple mitre joint design (not recommended):




Multiple mitre joints with a breaker board (recommended):



Another recommended option is to change the direction of the boards at the corner of the house:



Use STANDARD CLIPS in this application and insert the overhanging top part of the clip into the breaker board (as shown below).



You may choose to position your breaker boards to tie in with certain features of your home – for example: doorways, windows or just creating the feeling of a separate area. The use of breaker boards can greatly enhance the design of your deck.

SOLID STRUCTURES

A minimum end gap of 2mm-6mm applies when installing against solid structures. If you are installing in the peak of summer or on one of the hottest days for your location, you can reduce this gap to 2mm. If you are installing in the peak of winter or on one of the coldest days for your location, a gap of approximately 6mm should be left.


A minimum side gap of 6mm (auto spaced by clip) applies when installing against solid structures.

STORAGE & HANDLING

Ekodeck+ board must be:

- Supported at least every 600mm on a level plane.
- Laid flat especially during transportation and never at an angle.
- Never be dropped or 'dumped' when unloading.
- Stored on a flat, dry surface.
- Covered until it is time to use them for installation.

CLEANING AFTER INSTALLATION

A general clean is essential immediately after installation to remove tannins and surface debris from installation. To perform a general clean, scrub the deck in the direction of the grain with hot water mixed with dishwashing liquid or sugar soap using a medium bristle brush. Wash down thoroughly with a high-pressure washer or a garden hose with a fan spray nozzle. Squeegee off the water and mop any wet areas.



The use of a pressure washer greater than 1,500 PSI and/or applied closer than 30cm from the decking surface could damage the deck. Do not use dirt blaster type nozzles.

WARRANTY

For complete peace of mind Ekodeck+ comes with a 10 year warranty against manufacturing faults or defects.
